ORDER

WHEREAS, the Dr. R.N. Lahoti Ayurvedic College, Hospital and Research Institute at Sultanpur, Tal-Lonar, Buldhana-443307, Maharashtra was denied permission under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 to take admission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic year 2018-19 vide Ministry's letter no. R.12011/31/2015-EP (IM-1) for 2018-19 dated 20.09.2018;

2. WHEREAS, a copy of the above mentioned order dated 20.09.2018 was also sent to the Secretary, Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM), New Delhi for information and necessary action with the remarks that the resumption of admissions for the academic year 2019-20 may be considered by the Central Government on the basis of a recommendations of the CCIM based on an inspection to verify the Compliance submitted by the College in terms of the provisions under the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations;

3. WHEREAS, the CCIM had suomoto visited the college on 15-16.04.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance report submitted by the college and furnished its report and recommendations to the Central Government vide letter Ref.No.3-3/2019-Ay.(86) dated 07.05.2019, for the session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 with following shortcomings:-

A. Teaching staff-

- There is 01 higher faculty in department of Kayachikitsa against the minimum requirement of 02.
- There is no higher faculty in the department of Shalya Tantra and Panchkarma against the minimum requirement of 01 in each.
- There is no Bio-statistician against the minimum requirement of 01.
- Yoga teacher (Surekha Borkar) has not been considered as she is possessing PG qualification as MA (Sanskrit).

B. Herbal garden:-

Total number of species available is 151 against the minimum requirement of 250 as per RMS, 2016.

C. Few instruments/Equipments are not available in following departments-

- Rasashastra & Bhaishajya kalpana laboratory

- c. Physiology (Kriya Sharir) laboratory
- d. Pharmacogonosy laboratory (dravyaguna)

- i. Mean availability of essential and General instruments and equipments is 87.54%

D. As per visitors observation report i.e. part-II, serological examination procedures are not carried out and instruments/equipments are not available.

4. WHEREAS, the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made there under and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and policies issued from time to time for issuing Permission for this purpose;

5. WHEREAS, on examining the case in light of above notified & approved criteria and on perusal of visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility condition and the following deficiencies were found:

I. Teaching staff-

- a. There is 01 higher faculty in department of Kayachikitsa against the minimum requirement of 02 as per RMS, 2016.
- b. There is no higher faculty in the department of Shalya Tantra and Panchkarma departments against the minimum requirement of 01 in each as per RMS, 2016.
- c. There is no Bio-statistician against the minimum requirement of 01 as per RMS, 2016.
- d. There is no Yoga teacher against the minimum requirement of 01 as per RMS, 2016.

II. Herbal garden:-

- a. Total number of species available is 151 against the minimum requirement of 250 as per RMS, 2016.

III. Few instruments/Equipments are not available in following departments-

- a. Rasashastra & Bhaishajya kalpana laboratory
- b. Dissection hall
- c. Physiology (Kriya Sharir) laboratory
- d. Pharmacogonosy laboratory (dravyaguna)
- e. Rog-vigyan (pathology laboratory)
- f. Labour room
- g. Operation theatre
- h. OPD section
- i. Mean availability of essential and general instruments and equipments is 87.54% against the requirement of 90% as per RMS, 2016.

IV. Clinical Laboratory:- as per visitors observation report i.e. part-II, serological examination procedures are not carried out and instruments/equipments are not available.

6. WHEREAS, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned in para 5 above, the college was given an opportunity of hearing vide Hearing Notice No.L.14014/126/2019-EP(1) dated 18.05.2019 in terms of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the

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IMCC Act, 1970 to appear on 24.05.2019 at 10.00 AM before the designated Hearing Committee in the Ministry of AYUSH to present their case and to show cause as to why the permission to take admissions to UG (BAMS) course under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act for the year 2019-20 should not be denied to the college. The college was instructed to make oral as well as written submissions in respect of the case. The college was represented by Dr. K.S. Umare, Principal, and Mr. Mangesh M. Dawake, OS, of the aforesaid college. The representatives of the college submitted oral as well as written submissions against the deficiencies conveyed to them vide the Ministry's letter dated 18.05.2019.

7. WHEREAS, in view of the observation of the Hearing Committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM referred in para 3 above, it is found that, **Dr. R.N. Lahoti Ayurvedic College, Hospital and Research Institute at Sultanpur, Tal-Lonar, Buldhana-443307, Maharashtra** is not fulfilling the following basic minimum requirements for grant of permission for the academic session 2019-20:

i. **Shortage of Higher Faculty (Professor/Reader) in the following departments:**

Shalya Tantra	01
Panchkarma	01

Total shortage of 03 Higher faculty (Professor/Reader) in the Department of Kayachikitsa, Shalya Tantra and Panchkarma as per RMS, 2016.

(Teaching staff is essential for conduction of regular classes for the Students and necessary Patient care through the OPD& IPD services and play cardinal role in the functionality of the college & hospital.)

ii. **Required number of Part Time Teacher is not available as per RMS, 2016.**(i.e. Yoga teacher and Bio-statistician are not available against the minimum requirement of 01 each as per RMS, 2016.) **Part Time teacher is essential for conduction of regular classes for the Students and necessary Patient care through the Yoga and play cardinal role in the functionality of the college & hospital.**

iii. **Herbal garden:-**Total number of species available is 151 against the minimum requirement of 250 as per RMS, 2016.**(Herbal garden with demo room and required number of species is necessary for imparting knowledge about medicinal plants used in Ayurveda/Unani/Siddha system for the treatment of various diseases.)**

iv. **Few instruments/Equipments are not available in following departments-**

- Rasashastra & Bhaishajya kalpana laboratory
- Dissection hall
- Physiology (Kriya Sharir) laboratory
- Pharmacogonosy laboratory (dravyaguna)
- Rog-vigyan (pathology laboratory)
- Labour room
- Operation theatre
- OPD section

i. **Mean availability of essential and general instruments and equipments is 87.54% against the requirement of 90% as per RMS, 2016.****(Equipments & Instruments**

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are necessary for imparting practical training to students and also for
conduction of various clinical procedures in OPD/IPD/OT.)

v. Clinical Laboratory is not genuinely functional as per RMS, 2016. (It is very much
essential for providing proper medical care to OPD& IPD patients.)

8. WHEREAS, in view of the shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, it is
found that the said college is not fulfilling the requirements as per regulation 3 of RMS, 2016,
as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and other relevant regulations for
granting permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20;

9. NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the shortcomings and deficiencies particularly about
the non-availability of higher faculty in department of Kayachikitsa, non-availability of Higher
faculty in the department of Panchkarma, non-availability of Higher faculty in the department of
Shalya Tantra, non-availability of Biostastician, non-availability of Yoga Teacher, non-
availability of required number of species in herbal garden, non-availability of the
instruments/Equipments in following departments:- Rasashastra & Bhaishajya kalpana
laboratory, Dissection hall, Physiology (Kriya Sharir) laboratory, Pharmacogonosy laboratory
(dravyaguna), Rog-vigyan (pathology laboratory), Labour room, Operation theatre and OPD
section as per RMS and non-availability of functional Clinical Laboratory, which violate the
provisions of the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations and is of such a serious and
fundamental in nature that they adversely affect the ability of the College to provide quality
medical education in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations, it has
been decided by the Central Government for *denial of permission* to Dr. R.N. Lahoti
Ayurvedic College, Hospital and Research Institute at Sultanpur, Tal-Lonar, Buldhana-
443307, Maharashtra for taking admission to BAMS course with 60 seats in UG (BAMS)
course under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 for the academic session 2019-20.

10. Further, it is informed that the college is being provided a period up to 31.12.2019 to
fulfill the shortcomings observed during this year as mentioned in above paras along with the
following requirements, so that the CCIM may carry out inspection of the college for
consideration of matter for grant of permission for taking admissions in UG (BAMS) course
from the academic year 2020-21:

(i) All the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training
facilities as specified in Regulation 3 & 10 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council
(Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and
attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

(ii) All the Requirements of "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum
Standard of Educations in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for
Ayurveda college);

(iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant
Regulations made there under should be fulfilled *in toto*; and

11. This issues with the approval of the competent authority.


